- > Drivers are responsible for ensuring that passengers under 16 are secured properly.

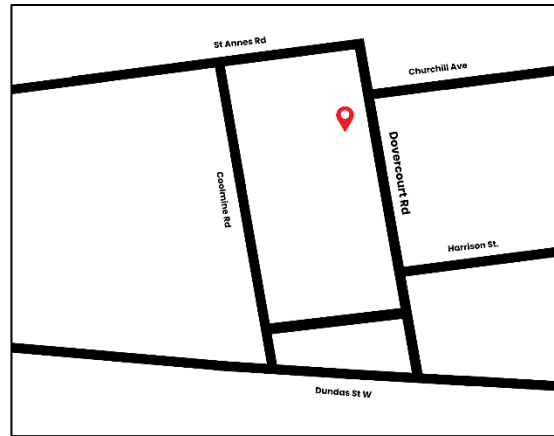

**Servicing Pedestrians & Cyclists**

The Highway Traffic Act requires that all collisions where persons are injured, or damage valued at more than \$2000.00 to vehicles or property, or damage to any highway property be reported to Police forthwith.

**What is a CRC?**

A Collision Reporting Centre is a Police and private facility that assist motorists in reporting motor vehicle collisions to the Toronto Police and if applicable, to the driver's insurer. The Toronto – Pedestrian & Cyclist Collision Reporting Centre located at 14 Division is open to pedestrians and cyclists who were involved in collisions in the jurisdictional boundaries of the Toronto Police Service.

# When Should a Pedestrian Or Cyclist Report?

**Ontario law requires all collisions where persons are injured, or where property damage exceeds \$2,000 among all vehicles involved, to be reported to the police.**

Any cyclist or pedestrian involved in a collision is to report their collision to a police officer – call Toronto Police Service for an officer to attend by dialing 911 (emergencies) or 416-808-2222 (for non-emergencies). For collisions not investigated at the scene, Pedestrians and Cyclists may begin their report online and complete it at one of the three (3) locations:

# Vehicles

A message from the Toronto Police Service.

**WITHOUT EXCEPTION, ALL VEHICLES MUST REPORT TO THE TORONTO NORTH OR TORONTO EAST COLLISION REPORTING CENTRE.**

The Toronto – Pedestrian & Cyclist location is not equipped to service drivers or vehicles.

# Action To Be Taken by All Pedestrians / Cyclists

1. Exchange information with the other involved person (obtain the vehicle plate, driver's name, driver's license number, addresses, phone number, and insurance information).
2. If any witnesses, obtain names and phone numbers of independent witnesses.
3. If the collision is not reported and investigated at the scene, start your report online or attend one of the Collision Reporting Centres most convenient to you (refer to the locations listed on this pamphlet).
4. If starting your report online, you will be contacted to attend one of the three CRCs to finalize your report. Your report is not complete, until you've attended a CRC.
5. Bring your documentation with you to the CRC. Any government card with photo, name, and current address (e.g. Driver's License, Provincial ID Card, Passport, Student ID. Health Card **NOT** accepted).

# Does the CRC take Fail to Remain Collisions?

YES – The CRC will take fail to remain collision reports. A police unit will be dispatched if the suspect vehicle is still in the area of the collision.
