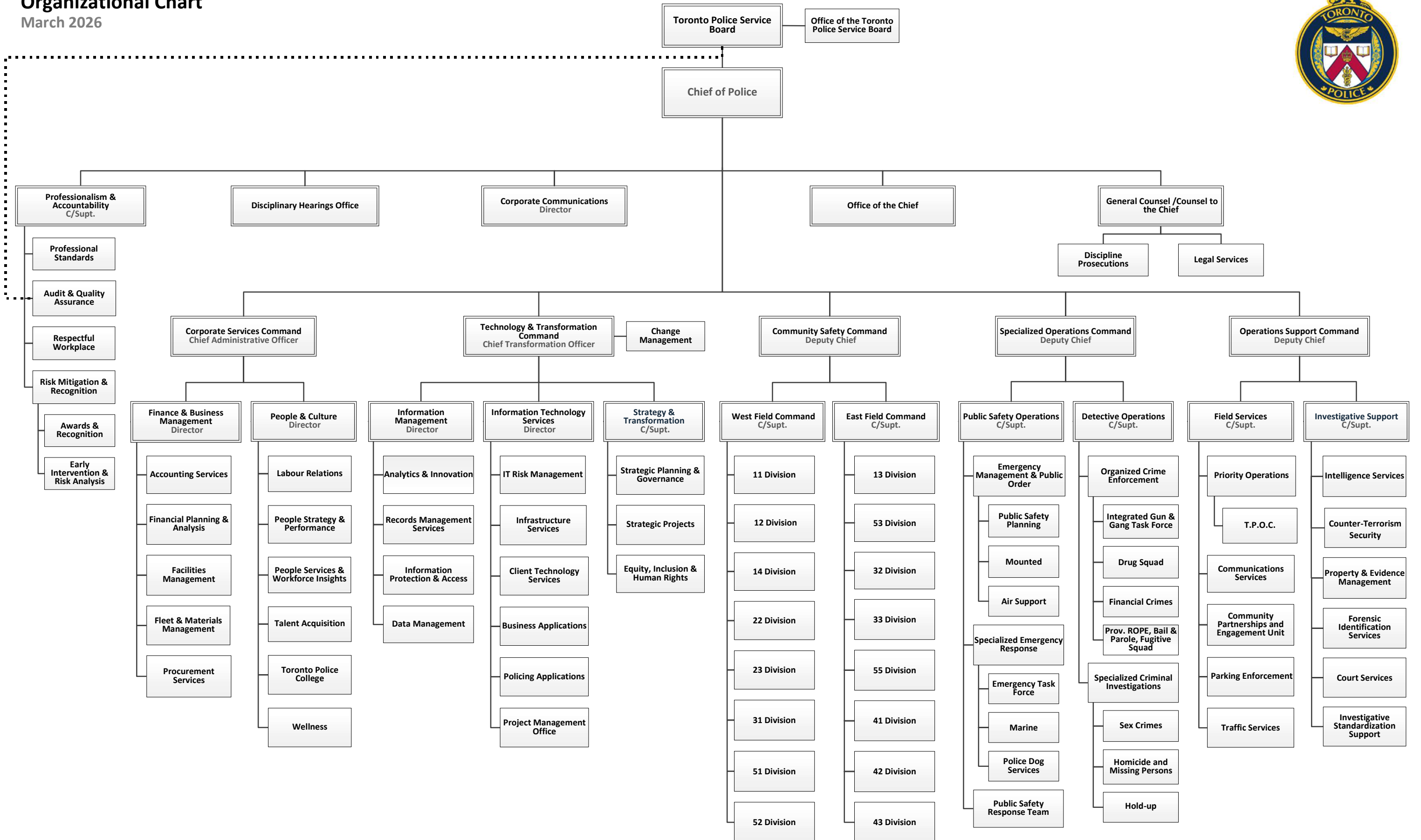


Organizational Chart

Toronto Police Service Board

The Toronto Police Service Board provides governance and oversight for the Toronto Police Service. The Board is supported by the Office of the Toronto Police Service Board.

Chief of Police

The Chief of Police reports to Toronto Police Service Board and is responsible for the overall leadership, administration, and operational direction of the Toronto Police Service.

Professionalism and Accountability

Professionalism and Accountability reports to the Chief of Police and is led by a Chief Superintendent, responsible for maintaining professional standards and organizational integrity. This area includes Professional Standards, Audit and Quality Assurance, Respectful Workplace, and Risk Mitigation and Recognition. Audit and Quality Assurance has a dotted line reporting relationship to the Toronto Police Service Board. Risk Mitigation and Recognition encompasses both Awards and Recognition and Early Intervention and Risk Analysis.

Disciplinary Hearings Office

The Disciplinary Hearings Office reports to the Chief of Police and is led by a Superintendent, responsible for formal disciplinary processes within the Toronto Police Service under the Police Services Act. This unit is currently adapting functions as a result of the introduction of the new Community Safety and Policing Act.

Corporate Communications

Corporate Communications reports to the Chief of Police and is led by a Director who is responsible for internal and external communications on behalf of the Service.

Office of the Chief

The Office of the Chief provides direct support to the Chief of Police in carrying out executive responsibilities.

General Counsel / Counsel to the Chief

The General Counsel and Counsel to the Chief provides legal advice and services to the organization and Chief of Police. This area includes Discipline Prosecutions and Legal Services.

Corporate Services Command

Corporate Services Command is led by the Chief Administrative Officer who reports to the Chief of Police, responsible for essential corporate and administrative services. Finance and Business Management, led by a Director, includes Accounting Services, Financial Planning and Analysis, Facilities Management, Fleet and Materials Management, and Procurement Services. The People and Culture portfolio, also led by a Director, includes Labour Relations, People Strategy and Performance, People Services and Workforce Insights, Talent Acquisition, the Toronto Police College, and Wellness. All Directors in this Command report to the Chief Administrative Officer.

Technology and Transformation Command

Technology and Transformation Command is led by the Chief Transformation Officer who reports to the Chief of Police, responsible for modernization and organizational change. This command includes Change Management, Information Management, Information Technology Services, and Strategy and Transformation. Information Management, led by a Director, includes Analytics and Innovation, Records Management Services, Information Protection and Access, and Data Management. Information Technology Services, also led by a Director, includes IT Risk Management, Infrastructure Services, Client Technology Services, Business Applications, Policing Applications, and the Project Management Office. Strategy and Transformation, led by a Chief Superintendent, includes Strategic Planning and Governance, Strategic Projects, and Equity, Inclusion and Human Rights. All Directors and Chief Superintendent report to the Chief Transformation Officer.

Community Safety Command

Community Safety Command is led by a Deputy Chief who reports to the Chief of Police, responsible for the delivery of front-line policing operations. West Field Command, led by a Chief Superintendent, includes 11, 12, 14, 22, 23, 31, 51, and 52 Divisions. East Field Command, also led by a Chief Superintendent, includes 13, 32, 33, 41, 42, 43, 53, and 55 Divisions. The Chief Superintendents report to the Deputy Chief of this command.

Specialized Operations Command

Specialized Operations Command is led by a Deputy Chief who reports to the Chief of Police, responsible for the delivery of specialized policing services. Public Safety Operations, led by a Chief Superintendent, includes Emergency Management and Public Order, which encompasses Public Safety Planning, Mounted Unit, and Air Support, as well as Specialized Emergency Response, which includes the Emergency Task Force, Marine Unit, and Police Dog Services. Public Safety Operations also includes the Public Safety Response Team. Detective

Operations, led by a Chief Superintendent, includes Organized Crime Enforcement and Specialized Criminal Investigations. Organized Crime Enforcement includes the Integrated Gun and Gang Task Force, Drug Squad, Financial Crimes, and the Provincial ROPE, Bail and Parole, and Fugitive Squad. Specialized Criminal Investigations includes Sex Crimes, Homicide and Missing Persons, and Hold Up. The Chief Superintendents report to the Deputy Chief of this command.

Operations Support Command

Operations Support Command is led by a Deputy Chief who reports to the Chief of Police, responsible for Field Services and Investigative Support. Field Services, led by a Chief Superintendent, includes Priority Operations, which encompasses the Toronto Police Operations Center, as well as Communications Services, Community Partnerships and Engagement Unit, Parking Enforcement, and Traffic Services. Investigative Support, also led by a Chief Superintendent, includes Intelligence Services, Counter-Terrorism Security, Property and Evidence Management, Forensic Identification Services, Court Services, and Investigative Standardization Support. Both Chief Superintendents report to the Deputy Chief of this command.
